The delay in publication was due to the extensive checking process which all reports go through and the holiday period, during which Ofsted do not publish reports. Everyone at school is very pleased with the outcome of the report which we are delighted to be able to share with you now. All reports highlight priorities for development. In the case of this report all of the identified actions were already targets for development this year, something which the lead inspector noted.

This Ofsted report is an excellent springboard for the year ahead and fully validates the vision of the school for all of our children. I would like to thank all of the staff for their hard work during the inspection.

Online Safety


